Jesus has commanded us to love our communities, our friends, family, other believers and even our enemies. Matthew 5:44. Jesus also stated that our love for one another would show He is true and real John 13:35.

The Lords eye: The eye of Jesus here represents the fact that He is always watching us, he is always with us. He sees the good and bad in our lives. Our Lord is omnipresent and there is nothing we can keep from Him. This image is a reminder to live a genuine faith filled life for our savior alone. We are not called to please men, but our ever present Jesus. Jeremiah 23:23-24

Mickey Mouse painting "stay Gospel centered": Mickey represents a very secular icon. Disney is known to bring in a lot of money.
